









FORECAST OF THE WORLD POPULATION - 2024 - 2100




FORECAST OF THE WORLD POPULATION BY CONTINENT - 2024 - 2100




RANKING OF COUNTRIES BY POPULATION - 1950 - 2100



GLOBAL POPULATION AGE STRUCTURE - 2025 - 2100







NIGERIA POPULATION AGE STRUCTURE – 2025 - 2100






